Who's Who In Walcott Fire Department Called Purebred Chickens

This week's column is written wholly without the consent of the man we are about to write about, and we ask his forgiveness.

It is about one of our young business men, a leader in the welfare of the community, whose ability and unquestioned integrity have been a decided factor in the successful re-organization of our bank through this period of business depression and serious panic.

Arnold Sindt "Arn" to most of us, we understand has just entered the "Fat and Forty" period in life, and was born on a farm near Walcott, received his education in the local schools, and by his farm experience is in a position to understand the farmer's problems.

He started his business career with the Farmers Savings Bank, later assuming it's cashiership, and is now cashier of the Walcott Trust and Savings Bank. He was united in marriage to Lillian Riessen, and one daughter, Shirley Ann was born to this happy couple.

During the World War, "Arn" answered the call of his country, and for over a year after his enlistment was stationed at Camp Dodge where he held a responsible position as company clerk, and had charge of all personal records with a Rank of Sergeant. Later he sailed with his division for France, with a short period of active service, and entered the Officer's Training School to prepare for a promotion to 2nd Lieutenant, but the armistice was signed and later his Company returned for demobilization. He is a member of the American Legion, as well as several leading fraternal organizations, including our local Knights of Pythias, and one of the organizers of our local Sportsmen's Association.

Raised on the farm with a genuine love for the out of doors, all his leisure time during his boyhood was spent in hunting, trapping, and learning the habits of our native birds and animals, and we doubt if there is a bird that habits this locality that he cannot recognize. No wonder then that to this day his hobby is still the out of doors and sports connected with it.

The local fire department was called Saturday afternoon to make a run to the Ruchmann farm near Davenport, where a grass fire spread to the straw stack, and threatened the farm buildings. This run of ten miles was made in record time, and firemen helped tear apart the straw stack and saved the farm buildings from destruction.

This just proves what an efficient Volunteer Fire Department can do for our community, and we know every farmer, as well as citizens of Walcott are real boosters for our boys. Our firemen are all local business and tradesmen, and drop their work to make these calls without any pay, because they have that public spirit, and we as a part of this community should back them to the limit.

The firemen are now making plans for the purchase of a new truck better equipped to fight fires, as the present equipment is inadequate to give real protection.

It is their intention to get a pumper truck equipped with a booster tank and all latest equipment, including standard fire hose to fight community one of the best equipped departments in the state, and will also help cu insurance costs.

At a later date when all necessary preliminary plans are completed they plan on calling a mass meeting for all citizens and farmers, present their proposition, and we hope the community as a whole will turn out and give these boys their well earned support.

Lost In Fire Friday

Lake Park News, Feb 1st. - Two hundred and sixty-eight purebred chickens were burned to death and the large chicken house completely destroyed in a fire at the August Roslansky farm in Sioux Valley Township last Friday evening. The fire is thought to have started from defective electrical wiring used for lighting purposes.

A call was put in at Lake Park, and the city fire truck made the run to the Roslansky farm, the building being a mass of flames. Stopping at a tank of water, the fire boys used the booster tank to soak the barn roof 40 feet to the east to prevent its catching afire from the flying embers, and turned the four inch hose on the burning building. Working with a pressure of 90 pounds, it took only a minute or two to extinguish all flames and danger of spreading fire.

The chicken house was approximately 15 by 25 feet in size and of recent construction. It was modern in every respect and housed the flock of purebred Rhode Island White chickens, a breed rarely found in this part of the country. Mrs. Roslansky had sold eggs to a Worthington hatchery for five years at premium prices, and the loss of this fine flock is keenly felt at this season of the year. Insurance was carried on both the building and the chickens.

The perfect adaptability of the city fire truck in fighting country as well as city fires is again demonstrated in the hands of our efficient fire department personnel.

We gratefully thank our neighbors and the Lake Park fire department for their efforts at our recent fire, in preventing a greater loss to our property.

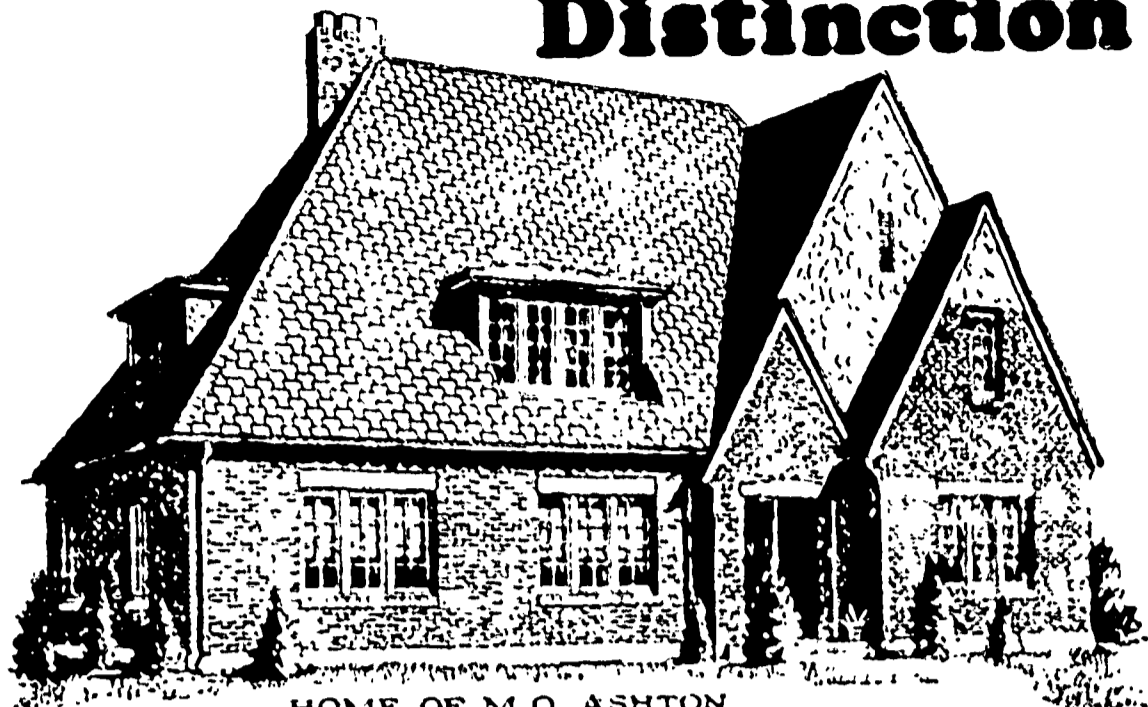

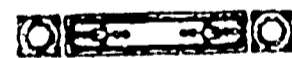
