This article is dedicated to the Irish population of Walcott—Namely for the good old Irish name of Koussebo-rovoritchizt.

We have inaugurated a new month of March and with it comes St. Patrick's Day. We cannot let the month pass altogether without some knowledge or reference to this old monarch.

"Oh, St. Patrick was a gentleman Who came of decent people.

So begins a ballad written in 1814 by two entertainers of Cork which goes on for many stanzas recounting the miraculous things that St. Patrick did for the Emerald Isle. If but half the legends were true, he would still be a remarkable and a very likable person.

The facts about him, however, are extremely meager. He was born in 389 AD in seven different places. Although he was the son of a Roman official he was given a christian education! At the age of sixteen he was carried off by Irish marauders and forced to tend herds in Ireland for six long years. While thus alone he frequently had religious dreams which increased in fervor until he escaped to France and entered a monastery. But he could not forget Ireland and he dreamed always that he was being called by strange voices to return to save that country. In 432 he was consecrated Bishop of Ireland.

The task of this courageous young man was far from easy because the nobles were Druidistic pagans, hence conflicts were inevitable. One convert gave him a barn and here the first few converts worshiped. Later, after the king's own brother had been converted, he gave Patrick his entire estate with which to found a church.

The most miraculous tale of all is how he rid Ireland of snakes. In an awesome voice he commanded all the serpents to go into the sea. One old "sarpint" however, refused so Patrick tricked him. He made a box and put hole in it after which he invited the snake to enter. He said the hole was too small for him so he finally had to crawl in, to prove it to the doubting St. Patrick.

No sooner was the snake inside when St. Patrick clamped on the lid and threw it into the sea.

A skeptical Irish landowner brought five harmless snakes home from England and turned them loose. When a scientist declared them to be snakes, the entire countryside was thrown into panic because if a snake were found surely St. Patrick's

The plant had been held in reverence before his time because it was believed to be a cure for snake bites and because snakes were never found on it. Because they were thus already familiar, the Shamrock made a symbol for the Trinity and as such they were used by St Patrick in a famous sermon to the Druid priest.





## Locust Has Appalling Record of Destruction

In spite of fuller knowledge of the life and habits of the grasshopper, the discovery that he emerges from permanent breeding grounds and does not materialize from the ether to satisfy the vengeance of a deity, and some improvement in the methods of exterminating him and curbing his activities, this insect still manages to do about as he likes.

In many countries and in all periods of history he has left his record of destruction. The most appalling report of his depredations comes from the pen of St. Augustine, who tells of a plague in Numidia which resulted in the death of 800,000 men. Pliny writes of swarms of African locusts that crossed the Mediterranean to Italy in his time. South Africa has suffered keenly from swarms of migratory locusts, and great damage is done by them to the crops of Argentina and Chile.

In many cases on record they are spoken of as having "come down from the north," whether the regions they victimize are in Africa, Chile or the United States. The recognized permanent breeding grounds of one species, the Rocky mountain locust, are in Montana and the western part of the Dakotas. This was the species that in the seventies were the aggressors in the greatest grasshopper plague known to this country.

## Hollanders in National Dress on Market Days

Quaint indeed is the custom in Middleburg, Holland, which decrees, and always has, that one goes to market in one's national dress. In effect, it means one's best clothes, but the same style as grandma and grandpa wore. Black is the universal color for men and women.

The men wear rather tight black coats of a cloth which they say lasts for thirty years. Big gold clasps decorate their necks. Tiny pin-cushion-shaped caps, or alternatively bowlers of the George Robey variety, as we know it, are the vogue.

Women dress somberly in black with almost crinoline-shaped skirts to their feet and wear snow-white headdresses, beneath which glow their natural expressions. Powder, rouge and lip salve are unknown. They arrive at the market in this medieval dress—mounted on bicycles.

## Early Rebellion Over Vast Manorial Estates

The first settled territory in New York was along the Hudson and consisted of vast estate or manors granted by the Dutch government to the patroons. The patroons held the land in fee and collected rents from the settlers. At first there was little objection to the system, but even before the Revolution trouble had begun. After the death of Stephen Van Rensselaer, one of the descendants of the original patroons, the rents fell in arrears and the "anti-renters" organized to resist payment. The anti-renters, supported by Seward Whigs and "Barnburner" Democrats, became a power in state politics. The state, however, was beaten in a suit testing the title of one of the patroons, and troops were sent to Rensselaersville to enforce the law. In 1815 an officer was shot in Delaware county while trying to collect rents and the governor proclaimed the county in a state of insurrection. The slayer was convicted of murder, but later pardoned by the governor. That was the end of the "anti-rent" war. Later the manorial estates were broken up.—Pathfinder Magazine.

## "Skimmity Ride"

A note recently appeared in an English paper being an account of a "Skimmity ride" accompanied by "rough music" in a Berkshire village, which not only astonished but puzzled thousands of readers who had never heard of such a custom. The Skimmity or Skimmington ride is an old-world method of holding up to reprobaton, or ridicule, a licentious neighbor, an unfaithful or quarrelsome couple, a man who beats his wife, or a husband who is badly henpecked. The proceedings vary in different districts, but generally include an effigy of the culprit or culprits, placed on a donkey, and escorted round the village by people dressed in grotesque costumes, to the invariable accompaniment of "rough music" produced by banging old tin pans and kettles. The effigy is hanged on an improvised gallows and burned.



## Fresh Coffee

ONCE upon a time there was a princess who was setting out for a far country to marry a prince. To carry as a gift to her new husband, her fairy godmother gave her an emerald as big as a golf ball, wrapped up very carefully. "Now don't think of taking this out until you get there!" cautioned the fairy. "This is a special emerald. The air is bad for it." "What an idea!" thought the princess. And just as soon as the fairy was out of sight, she unwrapped the blazing emerald and showed it to her attendants. And with it she dazzled the eyes of many people she met en route. But when she presented her gift, imagine her embarrassment! The emerald was dull. The air had robbed it of its brilliance. It had no more sparkle than an egg.

## Air is Also Bad for Coffee

Perhaps this sounds like an idle tale. But scientists tell us almost the same story about the bad effects air has upon coffee. As if to warn us to shield it, nature wraps the coffee bean in thick, tough pulp. Once these wrappings are removed and coffee is roasted, coffee's "sparkle" is dulled every time it is exposed to the air.

The reason for this is that certain gases brought out by roasting coffee escape into the air, taking the aroma with them. In thirteen days after roasting, much of coffee's richness is lost in this way, and, moreover, it turns stale.

## Vacuum Packed Coffee

Evidently the only way to bring coffee to your coffee pot with its strength unimpaired is to keep its gases in and the air out. This is precisely what is done when coffee is vacuum packed. When the coffee is roasted, before the aroma has a chance to escape, the surrounding air is sucked away, and the can is tightly sealed so that no air can creep in.

Thanks to the vacuum can, stale and dull coffee is being banished from our tables. Also embarrassing moments caused by serving uncertain coffee to new husbands or others we may wish to impress.\*
