Immunization

Program

On Saturday, March 10th, 1934 beginning at 1:00 P. M. an Immunization Clinic will be held at the Walcott school in charge of Dr. L. V. Schroeder assisted by Miss Blanche Eddy, rural health worker employed by the Scott County Tuberculosis Association and Miss Ethel Streuten. The purpose of this Clinic will be to prevent future occurrences of diphtheria in our community which has been singularly free from this dreaded illness ever since the last immunization seven years ago.

Two shots of toxoid instead of three as formerly required will be given for which a normal charge of 25c each will be made. However, all children will be given attention and no one should stay away because of this normal charge. As was previously done the Walcott School will assume the financial responsibility for all children in this district. Adult may have the Schick test given to determine whether or not they are susceptible.

Letters and notices to parents have been issued through teachers and pupils of the following schools: Cleona No. 1, 2, 4, 5, 6 and 7. Blue Grass 6, 8, 7, 5, Fulton 3M, and Fairview 1, 2, and 3 of Hickory Grove Township. It is essential that the replies to these be returned immediately to Miss Eddy at the court house in order that adequate supplies and necessary arrangements can be made for the clinic.

This immunization Clinic is absolutely optional with the parents and is in no way compulsory. Sometime in the future when a child has contracted a sore throat, fever, and a bad cold wouldn't it be a relief to know that your child has been safeguarded against diphtheria?

FUNERAL RITES OF

MRS. STEFFEN

Mrs. Elizabeth Steffen of Walcott died at 9 p.m. Wednesday Feb 21 at the home of her son, Herman Steffen Davenport, after an illness of the past year.

The desendent was born Jan 22, 1859 in Germany. She came to America with her father in 1874, directly to Walcott. She was married to Joachim Steffen in 1881. The couple then engaged in farming near Walcott until Mr. Steffen died and since that time his wife had resided in Walcott.

Funeral services were held Saturday at the Runge chapel from which burial was held in the Walcott cemetery.

CRASH NEAR WALCOTT

Three men suffered severe injuries in a similar collision two miles west of Walcott, near Davenport. The injured men, taken to Mercy hospital at Davenport, were Richard L. Gregory, 26, and Floyd Craig, 25, both of Marshalltown and occupants of one car, and William C. Suhr, a farmer near Davenport.

Craig suffered a broken hip and severe internal injuries. Gregory suffered a compound fracture of the right leg, internal injuries and cuts and bruises. Suhr's knee cap was broken and his face lacerated.

Dr. Schumacher

Dies At Walcott

Dr. Henry Schumacher, 78, Walcott physician, died at his castle home in Walcott Sunday after a long illness.

Before coming to Walcott, Dr. Schumacher practiced in Durant for 20 years. His castle there has attracted many visitors to the town. It was erected in 1904 and was patterned after the Bal Moral which was the summer home of Queen Victoria in Scotland.

In his museum are 50 guns of antique and curious designs from all parts of the world; over 6,000 Indian arrow heads, more than 200 tomahawks and many stamps and coins.

Funeral services for Dr. Henry Schumacher were conducted by the Walcott Knights of Pythias lodgt at lodge at the Wall and Fredericks Chapel Wednesday afternoon.

Pal bearers were Phil Petersen, Adolph Moeller, Ernest Werner, Frank Garlock, Herman Koch, and Robert Bennavitz.

Interment was made in the Walcott Cemetery.

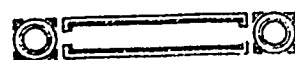

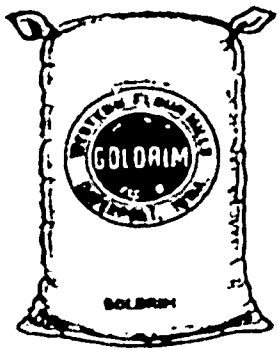

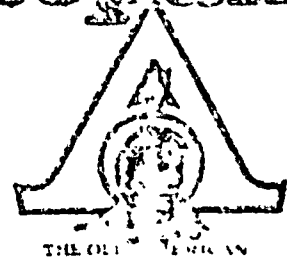
