Boy Is Shot By Playmate; Wound May Cause Death

WESLEY ROSTENBACH, 7, OF WALCOTT IS VICTIM OF ACCIDENT

Wesley Rostenbach, seven-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. William Rostenbach, residing on a farm near Walcott, is in Mercy hospital in Davenport in a serious condition from a bullet wound suffered Sunday afternoon when he was accidentally shot with a .22 calibre. He is being attended by Dr. L. V. Schroeder of Walcott.

The youth was shot by a playmate while his family was visiting at a neighboring farm. The bullet entered his right shoulder and took a downward course through his abdomen. He was brought to Mercy hospital, Davenport, here for medical treatment, and his recovery is doubtful, it was reported today.

And yet within that short space of time this earth clears itself of a whole population of us, and starts afresh. All our arguments and our quarrels and our triumphs and our joys pass into history with us.

Does that make our workaday struggles and aspirations seem trivial and pointless? I don't think so. On the contrary, it seems to me that each day takes on a much greater importance, when we stop to think how large a part of our life it is, in proportion to the whole.

I know that the effect of my friend's word on me was to make my mind say, "Hurry, hurry," for I suddenly realized how large a part of my life was gone, and how many days, weeks, and even years I had let slip by with little accomplished. It came to me that the vague notion I had held, that there will always be another day, was utterly false. Everything that I put over until tomorrow pushes something else ahead—and in the end I can never catch up.

From now on—or as long as the force of that truism remains with me—I think I will value each day a little more than I have in the past. I don't mean that I shall drive myself to work, work, work. 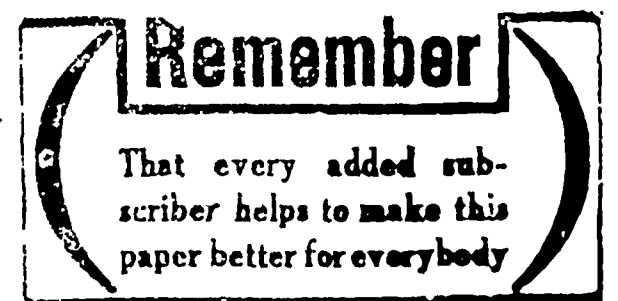

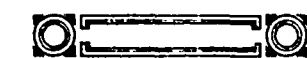

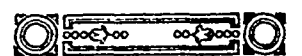
